

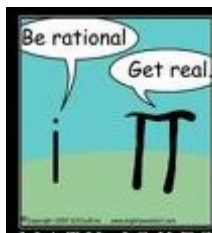
What is SUMS?

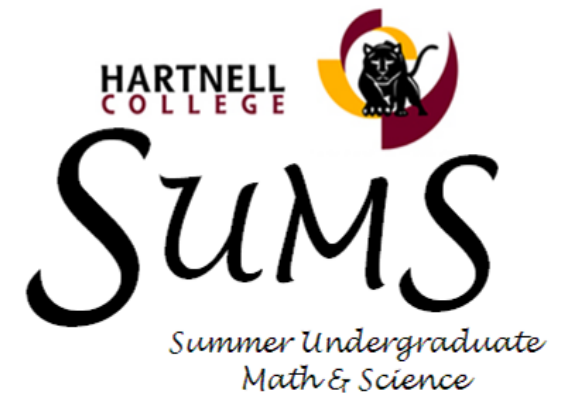

SUMS participants will receive the following benefits:

- Earn at least \$1,200 in stipend for participation during the summer and follow up activities during Fall 2010
- Earn at least two college credits
- Participate in hands-on math & science experiments and excursions
- Become familiar with Hartnell's environment and support services
- Interact with local scientists and inquire about their research
- Work with enthusiastic faculty from Hartnell and local universities



Responsibilities

Selected participants must:

- Attend a Saturday orientation session with parents or guardians in May 2010
- Participate each day of the summer program, including the few events scheduled on the weekends and evenings
- Contribute to group discussions, explorations and projects
- Be eager to explore diverse fields of math & science
- Volunteer in events that promote math & science to other students



Minimum Requirements

Applicants must have completed at least 2 years of high school science and advanced algebra with grades of C or higher.

How To Apply

Graduating seniors who plan on attending Hartnell College starting in Fall of 2010 are eligible to apply. Application materials will be available on our website in January 2010.

In addition to the application, students will also need to provide:

- Unofficial transcripts
- A completed recommendation form from a science or math instructor
