The Power of Connections

This week, I reflect on what I shared in a previous President's Report: the power of connection. Strong connections enable us to benefit from working together. It is about establishing common ground, developing meaningful relationships, and continuing to share our passion for the importance of student success.

Earlier this week, I attended a media meet and greet luncheon the Hartnell College Foundation hosted. The goal was to connect with local media partners who have helped shape the College's reputation through storytelling. These connections offer a mutually beneficial dynamic in which expanding our network will help improve how we connect with our communities.

A recent announcement inspires another meaningful connection I want to share. Hartnell College completed steps this week to become a "Home College" within the California Virtual Campus-Online Education Initiative (CVC-OEI).

As a home college, Hartnell students can now enroll in a course at any approved "teaching college" without being required to complete a separate application for admission. The student's course information is automatically transferred between institutions through cross-enrollment. As a "Home College," Hartnell now offers more opportunities for students to complete their program requirements.

Alisal Campus Tour and CTE Presentation

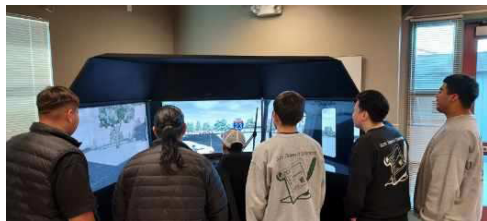
On November 18, 2022, students from Pajaro Valley Unified School District-New School received a tour of the Alisal Campus and received presentations in the following CTE Programs:

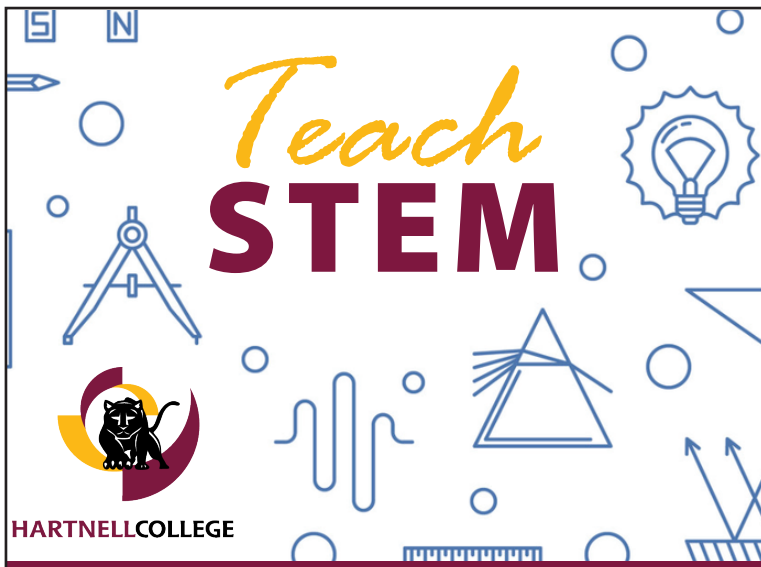
