1. Umoja Update Tony Anderson,

The Umoja program is a statewide program that was developed to assist the African American student population. There are 64 Umoja programs in the state. Umoja is a Kiswahili word meaning unity. It is a community and critical resource dedicated to enhancing the cultural and educational experiences of African American and other students. Umoja believes that when the voices and histories of students are deliberately and intentionally recognized, the opportunity for self-efficacy emerges and a foundation is formed for academic success. Umoja actively serves and promotes student success for all students through a curriculum and pedagogy responsive to the legacy of the African and African American Diasporas. 4. Study Areas Plan, Fall 2020 Augustine Nevarez
The study areas begin on November 30 in the large gym. There will be a 50 capacity and staffed by six staff members. Students can connect with Dr. Jainesh Singh for tutoring services online. Students and staff will be given a health screening where they are to answer questions such as if they have been in contact with people who were exposed to or are COVID-19 positive. There were concerns from Mr. Anderson and Mr. Pullum regarding safety. Mr. Pullum asked what will happen if someone refuses to wear a mask. Mr. Nevarez stated the student would be asked to leave. Campus safety is on site to assist with safety issues if they arise. There will be signs at the beginning of the check-in. There are over 600,000 masks available as well as gloves and hand sanitizers. They even have clear visors and gowns for staff to wear if they so choose. There are Plexiglas dividers installed in the gym as well. Access is at the core mission of the college. There are students who have issues with internet connectivity. These study areas will help with the technological gap some students have in completing their courses. There will be hands free temperature checkers. Jay asked for feedback from the students. Asking the students that do show up what the college can do to support them in their needs for next semester so that they may not need to come to campus. 5. HEP Grant Competition Laura Zavala
Ms. Zavala gave a detailed presentation regarding the HEP grant. The purpose of the grant is to help agricultural, fishery, cattle, poultry, nursery workers, and their families attain their high school equivalency (HSE, formerly known as GED) and enter into postsecondary training or improved employment. Hartnell is one of thirteen HEP programs in the state of California. There are 50 nationwide. The total funding of the grant is \$475k (\$2.3 million in three years). Every year Hartnell HEP adds over 400 potential students to their interest list. The HEP program pays all official exams, fees and re-takes, provides preparation materials for all five subjects, and also provides career and academic advising.
