This opportunity followed a similarly rewarding session with Hartnell employees on July 16. The full one-hour Zoom recording of the latest session is available [here](#).

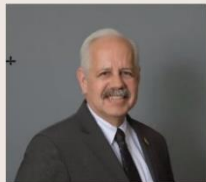
Participants included Monterey County elected officials, school administrators, social service partners, longtime college donors, proud alumni and several members of the Hartnell College Foundation Board of Directors,

as well as employees, students and two Hartnell Governing Board members, President Aurelio Salazar Jr. and Trustee Candi DePauw.

Our moderator was Jackie Cruz, vice president of advancement and development, who invited those on Zoom to introduce themselves and share a brief welcome. Individuals also asked thoughtful questions on such topics as Hartnell's focus on innovation, excellence in online instruction and local allies' support for student success.

Typical of the warm remarks were those from Mayor Mike LeBarre of King City, who cited the south Monterey County community's long and beneficial

Preparation continues for engaging Fall Convocation on Friday, Aug. 21

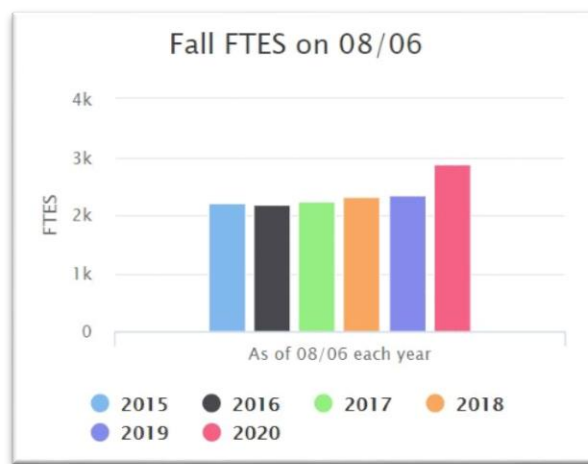
Hartnell faculty and staff are urged to participate in a Fall 2020 Convocation from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Aug. 21 as they prepare for the start of fall classes on Aug. 24.

The day’s theme is “Online Education: Make it Excellent, Make it Equitable.” Faculty will be able to join via a Canvas shell, and an optional Zoom link will be shared with all employees closer to the event.

The day will begin with a 30-minute welcome by Dr. Raúl Rodríguez, interim superintendent/president, followed by a professional development module on “Best Practices in Online Pedagogy.” The morning’s second module will be on College ReDesign, including meta-majors and program mapping. After a break for lunch, the day will continue with another module on online pedagogy, introductions of new faculty and academic-area meetings for instructors and deans.

A breakout session will follow each module. Watch your Hartnell Gmail for additional information.

A positive enrollment trend creates momentum as Hartnell approaches a fall semester when nearly all courses will be taught online. As of Aug. 6, full-time-equivalent enrollment (FTES) for Fall 2020 totaled 2,870, compared with 2,350 on the same date in 2019 (pictured).



TRiO/Student Support Services receives five-year ESL/SSS award

The SSS/TRiO program at Hartnell has received a second Student Support Services (SSS) award from the U.S. Department of Education, doubling its federal funding over the next five years.

In addition to the crucial renewal of its core SSS funding, totaling \$1.31 million, TRiO has received an equivalent five-year amount to serve students for whom English is a second language and are enrolled in regular college classes. The renewal funding will continue to serve 160 students who are first-generation, from low-income households and individuals with disabilities.

Manuel Bersamin, Hartnell's SSS/TRiO director (pictured), said the new ESL SSS project will serve 140 students from south Monterey County, including regularly scheduled programming at the expanded King City Education Center and the new Soledad Education Center.



Services to be funded by both awards include academic advising and coaching, tutoring, financial aid workshops, financial literacy education and bilingual parent workshops.

'Panther Backer' campaign to further success of Hartnell student-athletes

Building on a strategic plan developed by coaches, volunteers and Hartnell College Foundation staff, Hartnell Athletics has launched a "Panther Backer" fundraising campaign in support of student-athletes and their teams.



Through communications sent via email and direct mail, the effort will reach about 11,000 current and prospective donors and alumni-athletes over the next couple of weeks.

The campaign focuses on several areas of need: academic support, equipment, travel, scholarships and recruitment. In promotional materials, alumni athletes and student-athletes shared how their experiences reflect the potential impact of funding areas.

Among Hartnell students highlighted in the campaign is 2020 graduate Tyshell Johnson-Hill, who competed in track and field and will continue her studies this fall at Cal State Monterey Bay.

"I think my experience at Hartnell is what made me the person I am today," she said. "Before, I was really timid, but after I got into all the sports and the classes, I was more involved and more talkative, and I just felt more at home and more like myself."
