
It was an impressive success, showcasing ASHC's efforts towards our student body's mental health and well-being.



Forever Changing Chemistry Education: Dr. Pablo Romero's Impact on S Building

Last month, Dr. Pablo Romero visited the S Building at Hartnell College. Years ago, Dr. Romero generously donated \$250,000 to improve the Organic Chemistry lab after taking a Chemistry class. As a result of his donation, the college now has an advanced chemistry lab with 12 fume hoods, allowing more students to work simultaneously.

During his visit, Dr. Romero was delighted to see the impressive modern technology in the Organic Chemistry Lab and Instrument room, all made possible by his donation.

Furthermore, it was mentioned to Dr. Romero that Lawrence

Yee, following Dr. Krimsley's retirement, played a significant role in improving the Organic Chemistry class. As a result, Hartnell College has seen advancements such as the addition of advanced instruments like the Gas Chromatograph, High-Performance Liquid Chromatography system, Rotovap, and Findenser. 


