## INFORMATION/DISCUSSION/PRESENTATIONS

1. Financials Review Paul Luciano

Mr. Luciano presented the financial statements of Fund 46 the Measure T bond. The first document and the BEST report look at expenditures from July 1 2021 through Sept 30, 2021. The third document presents the spending of the fund from inception (2016) to Sept 30, 2021. On the BEST and second document are three columns; the budget, the sum of actual expenditures for that account and the percentage spent of the account budget. The last document has a column for each fiscal year since inception and the total of expenditures for each year.

The Soledad figure is depicted to be over budget, however, due to an omission in listing the remaining budget for new construction it appears to be over budget, however it is not. This project came in under budget (all costs).

2. Status of Projects Joseph Reyes

Mr. Reyes gave an update on the status of the projects.

Series A or Phase I projects consisted of Bldgs. D and E and the QUAD/ADA renovation, new nursing and allied health building, new Soledad education center, new Castroville education center. Of these, Soledad and King City are complete (done so in Spring of 2021). The nursing and allied health building and the Castroville building will be complete by end of the year and hold classes in Spring 2022. Building E has had the restrooms renovated on all three floors, and the new elevator is pending completion with the installation of the smoke doors. The classrooms of building E will be scheduled for work and completion in the Fall of 2022. That will compete the first series.

Series B or Phase II are buildings B  $2^{nd}$  floor, J and K (Visual and Performance Arts). Under review is the practice field and a new building at Alisal campus. Currently Bldgs. J and K are at DSA under plan review. The estimate done at time of planning was approximately \$100,000 over the initial estimate. Building B is out to bid for start in January 2022. The practice field and Alisal are under review as it is ascertained how well the budget is holding up against actual expenditures. The projects have run consistently around 25-30% over budget. This is a result of higher labor and material costs and also that the budget utilized is from 2016. The college is continually looking to augment the budget with other sourced funds, as was done in Phase I. There is a potential of matching funds from the state that the district has applied for and should those monies become available has position Hartnell close to the top of the list for the funds.
