Program Overview

- One semester commitment fellowship ***
- Fellows will engage in experiential learning, professional development, and the opportunity to network with students, faculty, staff, and community members from diverse backgrounds.
- Fellows will also develop leadership, critical thinking, and facilitation skills; explore equity issues affecting historically underrepresented groups, and play an important role in identifying ways to address issues of equity on campus and the larger community.
- The fellowship is a stimulating journey of personal and professional growth.

Qualifications

- Be enrolled in at least 6 units at Hartnell College.
- Be available for group and one-on-one meetings
- Be available to dedicate 5 hours a week to service-learning or a community-engaged research project.

- Demonstrated interest in identifying and addressing issues of equity in the Salinas Valley and/or larger society.
- Come from a diverse background (e.g. race/ethnicity, sexual orientation, immigration status, national origin, etc.)

● Additional criteria to be considered ●

Individuals that are currently undocumented, do not possess work authorization, and/or who have been impacted by the justice system are highly encouraged to apply.

The Office of Equity Programs recognizes system impacted individuals as those who have been incarcerated, those with arrests/convictions but no incarceration, and those who have been directly impacted by a loved one being incarcerated.

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* Fellows will have the option to participate in service-learning at a local community organization or develop a community-engaged research project that focuses on exploring issues of equity in the Salinas Valley and/or larger society.

* Fellows who choose to participate in service learning will work closely with a community partner to identify and address issues of equity. Students will engage in critical self-reflection, critical thinking, planning and implementation, and leadership development through service learning.

* Fellows can connect with specialists and experts working to advance equity.
