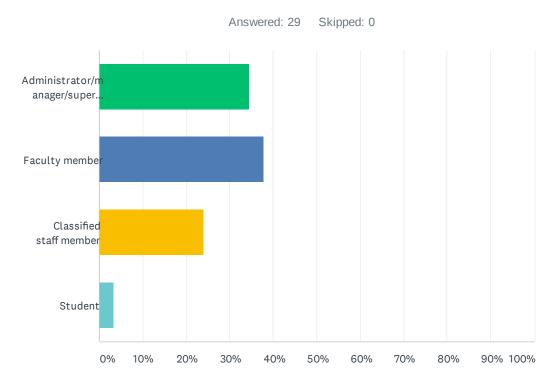
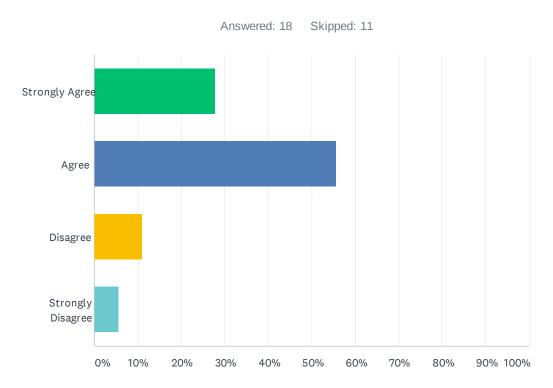
Q1 Employment classification

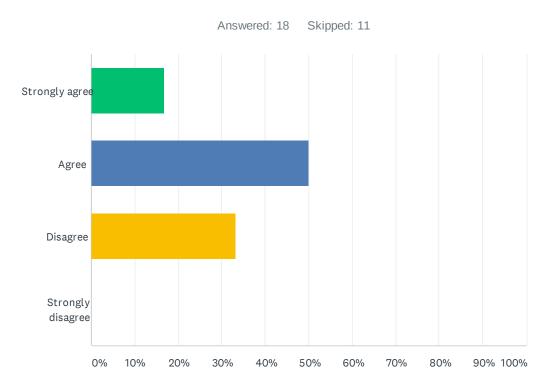

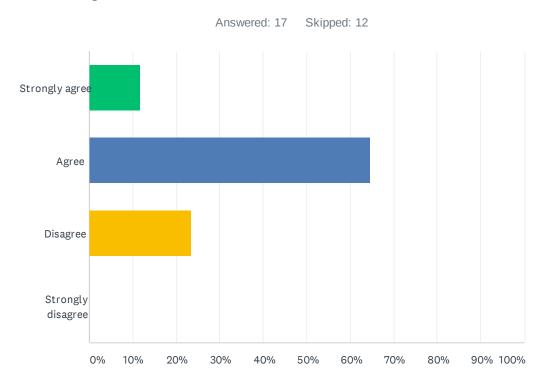

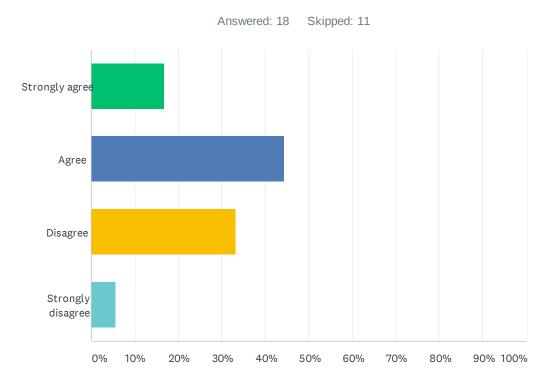
