CALLED TO ORDER

The meeting called to order at 3:02 p.m.

3. Hartnell College – A Student Centered Institution

Dr. Lofman presented an organizing document that speaks to the "big picture" alignment among the four student success goals in the strategic plan, the four institutional priorities, and a wide array of college redesigns that are being designed, being prepared for implementation, or are in process of implementation. Entitled "Hartnell College - A Student Centered Institution," the main thrust is to show how the College is moving toward becoming increasingly more focused on students, their experience and, ultimately, student success. The document provides a framework for understanding the relationships among the goals and priorities on the one hand, and key strategies, approaches, or ways through which the priorities will be emphasized and the goals will be achieved, in addition to the institution's commitment to following through to ensure that student success is maximized, student equity gaps are closed, and systemic injustice is eliminated.

4. ASHC Student Survey

Dr. Lofman introduced the ASHC Return to Campus Survey. Dr. Trengove gave a presentation to the CPC sharing the student responses on their perceptions/attitudes on a return to in-person learning.

Results from the ASHC Return to Campus survey indicate that students have adapted to online learning having overcome many of the technical issues experienced in the 2020SP semester (i.e., access to computers/laptops and internet reliability). Many of the respondents (57%) said that they were slightly/very uncomfortable with in-person learning citing personal/family member's health concerns and/or convenience of online learning. Many (68%) said that vaccinations should be mandatory/very important for staff, faculty, administrators and students before resuming in-person learning.

5. Academic Senate Town Hall on Anti-Racism Report

Cheryl gave an update on the Town Hall that occurred on April 20, 2021 on Black Equity. The senate was happy to host, there were between 35-40 combination of faculty, staff and management in attendance. Two great guest speakers: Dr. Jessica Ayo Alabi, Orange Coast College and Karla Kirk, Fresno City College. It was great to hear their perspectives and share conversation and dialogue. The senate is proud to be doing this type of work and will continue to have these courageous conversations.

6. Update from the PFT on Race, Equity, and Social Justice Jackie Cruz/Lisa Storm/Nina Vasquez

The President's Task Force representatives presented on the work the group has been leading. The task force has met weekly since last November and have come up with recommendations. One of their recommendations is to adopt the Student Success and Equity Committee's Equity Commitment Statement institution-wide. Jackie talked about the importance on knowing our community, their needs and issues so we can truly be student centered.

Lisa touched on the classroom climate and review of first responder curriculum. After reviewing the equity rubric, equity lens, and Peralta's equity rubric, the committee decided to start with a systemic use of the student success and equity committee equity rubric, and the curriculum committee equity lens. Further recommendation is to catalog equity minded courses so that students will see and be drawn to them. It is also recommended that we inform and promote new ethnic studies courses to students to fulfill the CSU requirement and supporting our students at a foundational level and completing transferrable courses at a lower cost. It is also recommended that we enhance education for law enforcement officers and other first responders.

The Presidential Task Force's recommendation is to add equity to the Strategic Plan, Mission Statement, Vision Statement, Values Statement. In order for the college to truly embrace equity and measure our progress and be accountable of our work it needs to live at the highest level.

7. Update on Pandemic and Return to Campus Activities

Dr. Rodriguez shared with the CPC the work the Return to Campus Committee has been doing, he reminded the CPC that negotiations and MOU for return to work is currently happening and hopefully an agreement with the bargaining units will be will be reached soon.

He spoke on the vaccination clinic happening on campus, Friday, April 23 as well as testing on the back part of the Gym. He shared his hopes to continue to have vaccination clinics on our campus available for our students. A consultant was brought in to help move the college and getting a timeline in place to help us movie it faster on returning to campus.
