# Credit for Prior Learning (CPL)

#### **Umbrella Term**

More expansive regulation and revised AP 4235 in 2020-21.

Slight revision proposed in 2025.

CPL Includes (the easy stuff):

Credit by exam

HS Articulation (a specific form of credit by exam)

AP/IB/CLEP exam scores

Military Joint Service Transcripts

# Credit for Prior Learning (CPL)

CPL also includes more complex methods,

Faculty determine eligibility for an (automatic) A&R process:

Eligible industry credentials/certifications

Eligible industry exams

Any student coming in with these knows they are eligible

No faculty review is necessary–faculty have already identified

# Most Difficult Type

#### Non Automatic Certifications

Student arrives with a certification that isn't already on our books

Faculty review the competencies of the certification against course competencies. Certification could be added to the list of standard industry certifications.

#### Portfolio Review

Faculty review portfolios submitted by students

Portfolio is assessed against standards based on COR

#### How would it work?

Students get credit on their transcript (noted that it is CPL)

One or more courses

Based on equivalence of outcomes between CPL and course outline(s)

Can be predetermined or "pre-approved" and done through A&R systems

HS articulation, AP tests, known industry certifications, military transcripts

If a course is ineligible for CPL it is documented in the COR

# Credit for Prior Learning (CPL)

Step 1: Faculty awareness

Step 2: Identify courses eligible for each type (faculty through curriculum process)

Step 3: Develop processes for the more complicated types of CPL (Involves Curriculum Committee and affected faculty)
