BP 3540 Sexual and Other Assaults on Campus

Any sexual assault or physical abuse, including, but not limited to rape as defined by California law, whether committed by an employee, student or member of the public, that occurs on District property, including off campus grounds or facilities maintained by the District, or upon grounds or facilities maintained by affiliated student organizations, is a violation of District policies and procedures, and is subject to all applicable punishment, including criminal procedures and employee or student discipline procedures. Students, faculty, and staff who may be victims of sexual and other assaults shall be treated with dignity and provided comprehensive assistance.

The superintendent/president shall establish administrative procedures that ensure that students, faculty, and staff who are victims of sexual and other assaults receive appropriate information and treatment, and that educational information about preventing sexual violence is provided and publicized as required by law.

The procedures shall meet the criteria contained in Education Code Sections 67385, 67385.7, and 67386, and 34 Code of Federal Regulations Section 668.46.

A campus safety plan shall be developed and students shall be informed about campus safety and the campus safety plan at the new student orientation. The District shall ensure that emergency procedures are posted in each classroom, and that the campus safety plan is reviewed regularly and posted on the District website.

The Director of Public Safety and Emergency Management shall prepare and annually update a report of all occurrences reported to campus security personnel of, and arrests for, crimes that are committed on campus and that involve violence, hate violence, theft or destruction of property, illegal drugs, or alcohol intoxication, and of all occurrences of noncriminal acts of hate violence reported to campus authorities. An annual written report will be submitted to the Governing Board.

Written records of noncriminal acts of hate violence shall include at least a description of the act of hate violence, the victim characteristics, and offender characteristics, if known.

BP 3500 Campus Safety

The Board of Trustees is committed to a safe and secure District work and learning environment. To that end, the superintendent/president shall establish a campus safety plan and ensure that it is posted or otherwise made available to students.

The campus safety plan shall include the availability and location of security personnel and methods for summoning assistance of security personnel, any special safeguards that have been established, any action taken in the preceding 18 months to increase safety, and any changes in safety precautions to be made during the next 24 months.

The Board of Trustees is committed to providing a District work and learning environment that is free of violence and the threat of violence. The Board's priority is the effective handling of critical workplace violence incidents, including those dealing with actual or potential violence.

The superintendent/president shall establish administrative procedures that assure that employees are informed regarding what actions will be considered violent acts, and requiring any employee who is the victim of any violent conduct in the workplace, or is a witness to violent conduct to report the incident, and that employees are informed that there will be no retaliation for such reporting.

BP 3515 Reporting of Crimes

Reference: Education Code Section 67380

The Superintendent/President shall assure that, as required by law, reports are prepared of all occurrences reported to District's campus security office of and arrests for crimes committed on campus that involve violence, hate violence, theft or destruction of property, illegal drugs, or alcohol intoxication. The Superintendent/President shall further assure that required reports of non-criminal acts of hate violence are prepared. Such reports shall be made available as required by law.
