5 YEARS

The 13,600-square-foot Castroville Education Center will be a higher education resource for Castroville and all of north Monterey County. It will serve as a community hub, partnering with industry, high school and middle and elementary schools to create a strong pathway to college. This center will serve the community through offerings of general education-requirement courses for an associate and associate-for-transfer degrees and career-technical certificates.

OPERATIONS SEED MONEY

Bond Measure T provided \$13.1 million in capital for Hartnell College to construct the buildings and purchase the basic furniture and equipment for the classrooms. We need to raise \$1.36 million to provide seed money for the first five years of operational costs associated with opening a new center.
