When submitting completed DSPS Adobe Forms, students will be prompted to enter an email address. Students should ensure it is an email address they have access to.

Log into the email address entered on the Adobe Form, click on the link to verify the form is valid. The form is then emailed to DSPS and held in a confidential manner

- Email, mail, or bring the Verification of Disability documentation such as: Most recent IEP, 504 Plan, Psychological Report, Medical Verification, Audiology Report
- Call or email DSPS to schedule an Intake appointment with a DSPS Counselor
- During the Intake, a student will discuss courses, disability accommodations, and your rights and responsibilities as a DSPS student

Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Division

Purpose

The Math, Science, and Engineering program at Hartnell College offers Associate Degrees in Astronomy, Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Engineering, Mathematics, and Physics. Generally, degrees in Math, Science, and Engineering lead to transfer to a four-year institution. With a four-year degree, possible careers include research, teaching, engineering, medicine and other health sciences, and work with government agencies and private companies.
