- **Satisfactory Academic Progress (or SAP)**
 - a Federal regulation that provides to determine whether a student is making sufficient progress in order to maintain eligibility for Financial Aid.
- Academic records are reviewed at the end of each semester (Fall, Spring, & Summer) to determine a student's status



If a student is on Unsatisfactory SAP status they are ineligible for all Federal Title IV Financial Aid (cash aid). Such as:

- Pell Grants
- SEOG
- Federal Direct loans
- State Cal Grants



- **GPA:** Students must maintain a cumulative 2.0 GPA or better (Qualitative measurement)
- **Pace of Completion:** students must pass 67% or more of total attempted units (Quantitative measurement)
- **Maximum Time Frame:** students must finish their program within the max amount of units allowed. In most cases, this is 90 units for certificated programs; or within 150% of the length of an academic program.
- **Student has NOT received a BA/BS degree**



A student has attempted **60 units** but has **only passed 37 units**, The student only passed 62% and does not meet the 67% requirement.

- $37/60=.62$

***Note: Withdraws do not count towards GPA, but do count towards the Pace percentage.**



- Must be consistent with the student's **Educational Plan**
- Must be kept up to date with **Admissions & Records**

Students can submit SAP Appeals **no later than Friday, May 8, 2026**. However, this does not guarantee the SAP appeal will be approved.

Not completing courses impacts students in more ways than SAP:

- Withdrawing or dropping from courses may result in adjustments to your Financial Aid awards, and in some cases, **you may be required to repay financial aid.**
- If you withdraw from all of your classes before completing more than 60% of the semester, you will be required to return any unearned federal funds.
- If you receive all F grades or a combination of F/NP or W, you will be required to return any unearned federal funds.



Hartnell College has a set **SAP Appeal Committee** that reviews each appeal form and makes a decision based on a set criteria for all students.

Once a decision has been made students will be contacted with further details and instructions.
