4.2 Rainbow Refresh

President Atrisco

Discussion (5 mins)

Rainbow refresh was a very good opportunity to get to interact with students. During the rainbow refresh, there were agua frescas. Cucumber agua, pina agua frescas were passed out. The most popular drink amongst the students was the pina agua fresca. There were many incoming students; many took this as an opportunity to ask questions and familiarize themselves with the sort of classes that are available. Many of the incoming students asked for advice on which classes they should take during their first year. There were 104 people who checked in.

V. New Business

5.1 Constitution Overview

Advisor Burfeind

Discussion (25 mins)

Dan spoke about the ASHS constitution. There was a general overview of the government document. There were two themes that were especially important; inclusion and the requirements that members should have. The GPA requirements were spoken about. Representation and the need for it was discussed; doing a good job when representing the student body was spoken about in detail. Representatives should be here for students; they should be there to add value to meetings in regards to voicing opinions/ inclusion of the perspective and diversity of opinion in the student body. There was a call to action/ a bit of plating the seed that Dan left us with: read the constitution. Questions were encouraged to further grasp the responsibility that each position holds. One of the most profound aspects was the notion that when you are being quiet during a meeting, or maybe unprepared, you might be letting 1,000 students down, which highlights the gravity of using one's voice. There is a lot more programming in the office than there ever was in the constitution. There were questions on whether that's something we wish to continue or shift away from. Dan Orta brought up a question of whether it could be helpful

5.2 Role Overview

President Atrisco

Discussion(10 mins)

President Atrisco gave a brief overview of each member's roles. She discussed attendance and the importance of attending each meeting. It is especially important to communicate whenever attendance is not possible. In the future, emails are

preferred in advance. When speaking of participation, it was said that members are required to lead one event during the semester, participate in at least two events throughout the semester, sign up for as many events that are able to when announced, and actively add to the planning/ execution of events. Members are also expected to complete office hours which include: helping clean up after events, organizing student government materials, planning future activities and events, and helping setup. Participation and engagement will be monitored throughout the year; if these requirements are not met there will be consequences.

5.3 Budget Overview Treasurer Perez Discussion/Action (15 mins)

This item is to discuss and take action on the budget.

Treasurer Perez spoke about the budget breakdown for the fiscal year of 2026 to 2027. She identified where the money comes from. There is the total dollar fee that we pay per semester. There are two different categories: there is non- discretion and operational. There was a general overview on where the \$12 activity fee goes: \$2 goes towards representation, \$3 goes towards MST, and \$1 goes towards athletics, \$1 for western stage and \$5 for ASHS. Typically students maintain that every semester, so the experiences that most students have are paid for by students. The budget typically ends up being \$140,000, and \$5 goes towards ACG. From there we get into categories which are: operational, discretionary, and non discretionary. The non discretionary fund is allocated, since the non discretionary fund covers a part of the salaries of the advisors and it covers our stipend; same with the operational, it covers the office: which include office supplies, maintenance, and travel. The discretionary is what is directly used/approved for events, retreats and ICC.
