"Each February, National Black History Month serves as both a celebration and a powerful reminder that Black history is American history, Black culture is American culture, and Black stories are essential to the ongoing story of America — our faults, our struggles, our progress, and our aspirations" ("A Proclamation on National Black History Month, 2022"). To highlight Black contributions that have often been dismissed throughout history, President Gerald Ford officially recognized Black History Month in 1976. Whether that be literature from Black authors and poets that shine a light on the Black experience or paintings and songs from Black artists and musicians during the Harlem Renaissance, African American contributions have shaped American culture and its history to its core. Equally as important, Black History Month calls for us to remember those who fought and continue to fight against the injustices present in their community; To remember those who understood that waiting was no longer a solution to arbitrary or discriminatory treatment; To remember those who demanded the fulfillment of the Declaration of Independence and the fourteenth Amendment's equal protection clause, long denied to African Americans; And to remember those who dreamed of an America where pedigree did not limit people from exercising their unalienable rights. 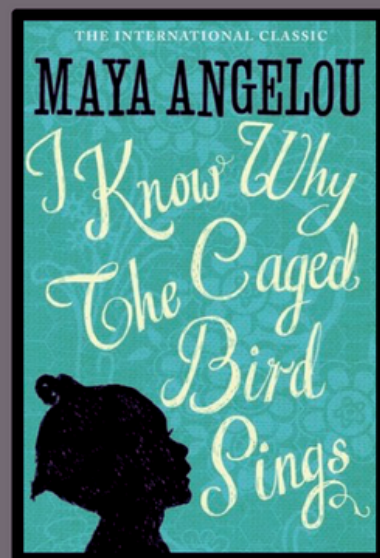
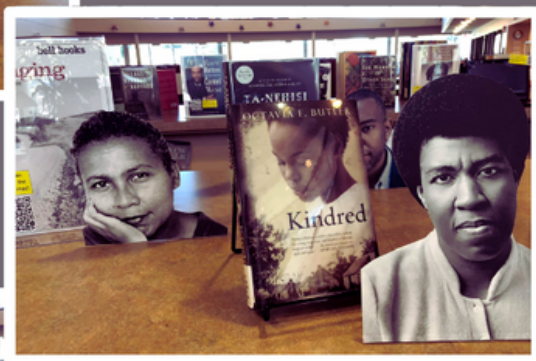

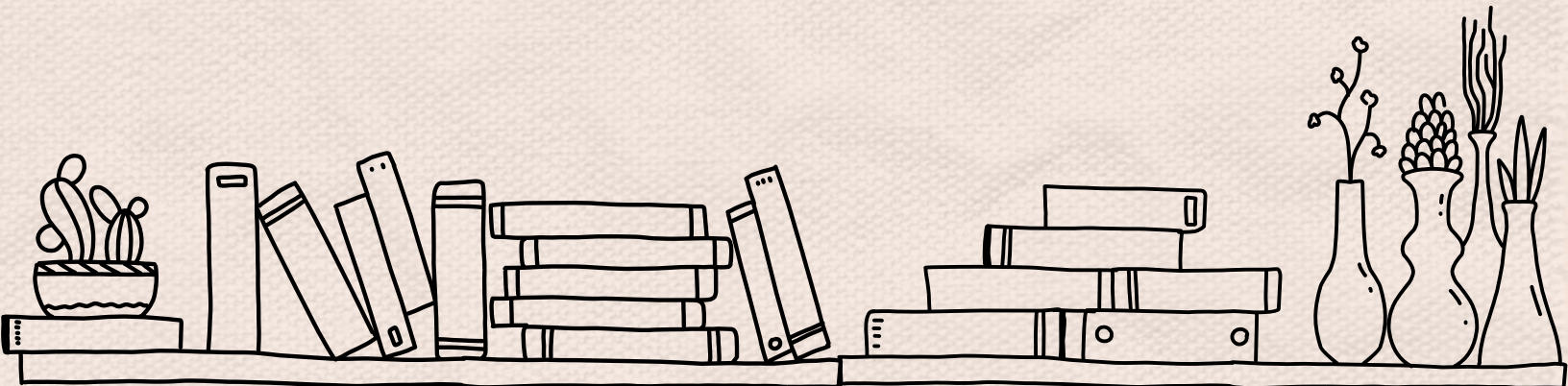

CATCARD UPDATE

THE ELECTRONIC ID (CATCARD) SYSTEM IS CURRENTLY UNAVAILABLE, A DETAILED EMAIL WILL BE SENT TO STUDENTS ONCE IT IS BACK IN OPERATION.

- Funds will remain on your Cat Card as long as you are currently enrolled. If you are not enrolled, your funds will not be available. Funds will be accessible once the Cat Card issue is resolved.
- If you ride MST (bus system), you are still able to ride for free. Simply notify the bus driver that you are a Hartnell student. If you have any issues, please write down the bus line number and time, reach out to the Office of Student Life, and they will contact MST.
- For bookstore voucher credit, you will need to go to the bookstore and display your class schedule. They will then be able to assist in obtaining your books and class materials.
